This week has been National Apprenticeship Week and students have had some brilliant opportunities to engage with apprentices from a number of organisations. Through our role as a UTC, we work with Springpod - a platform that has created live webinars for students to ask questions to the employees of Airbus, Jaguar Land Rover, and Atkins (amongst many others).

We have also launched the 2019 work experience programme for Year 10 and 12 - please see the details in this bulletin for more information. All students are expected to go out on placement during the summer term.

The professional appearance of students has improved since introducing the college's new strategy on students wearing coats and trainers around the building. Work Experience

A work placement is a brilliant opportunity for students to enhance their skill set, develop their CVs, and prepare for the working world. This is the very reason our UTC was set up.

It is expected that all Year 10 and 12 will go out on work placement from 8th July - 19th July. All students need to be sourcing a placement; if students can't source two weeks work placement, one of the weeks can be spent on placement and the other will be spent in college.

This is a valuable opportunity for students to speak to staff and parents about employer connections and source their work placement. Students received an introduction to work experience on Tuesday - they were advised that employers are more receptive to students who take the initiative and contact the companies directly.

Students will need to download the Connect App to manage their work placement. They will be supported by their PAT tutors who have been trained in how to use this system. Employers will also be allowed to leave feedback on each student who has completed a placement - first impressions count!
