YEAR 13 TRIP TO MANCHESTER METROPOLITAN UNIVERSITY

Engineering BTEC students and a small number of year 11 attended a trip to MMU last Thursday (12/9/19) for non-metallic testing of materials. The testing involved students conducting tensile testing of a variety of different polymers to test their limits before fracture/breaking.

Students also had the opportunity to be taught by Dr Simmons regarding polymers and the environment, along with a visit to the 3D Printing Studio, Automotive Centre, Sports Engineering Department and Product Design Lab.
