RESULTS SUCCESS AT UTCW

UTC Warrington students have been celebrating their best ever set of results. At GCSE, there was a notable improvement in core academic and technical results across the board. In sixth form, Year 13 leavers benefitted from another year of 100% pass rate in BTEC Level 3 Engineering and the average grade increased to a Double Distinction award. We have also seen a number of students leave the UTC to begin their careers in the field of STEM. Moneka Duffy will begin a Degree Apprenticeship in Mechanical Design Engineering with Sellafield Ltd, whilst Jack Davenport will work with BAE Systems to begin a Degree Apprenticeship in Aeronautical Engineering. Will Arnold, one of our Year 11 leavers, has joined Wood PLC to begin an apprenticeship in Project Controls. We wish all of our students the very best of luck in their careers!

DISRUPTION FREE LEARNING UPDATE

We have made a number of changes to the Disruption Free Learning policy to reflect the start of the new term. Any students who are removed from lessons will now receive an automatic same day 1 hour detention which will take place after college. The procedures in the classroom remain the same for all students. We have seen a significant improvement in engagement across the college since the introduction of this policy in January 2019, as recognised by Ofsted. We are keen to continue this hard work in delivering an excellent experience for our students.

ATTENDANCE

For those Key Stage 4 students who arrive after 8.30am, they will be issued with a lunchtime detention of half an hour. Failure to attend this will result in a same day 1 hour detention which will take place after college. Good attendance is important across all year groups. Being in college everyday allows students to maximise their learning, make new friends, sample new experiences and provide them with the best possible approach to their future career path.

PARENT PAY
