
IMPORTANT MESSAGE: BUS PASSES AND RAIL TICKETS

As of Monday 21st October, travel tickets for both rail and bus services will only be renewed each Monday. Students will be required to leave their pass at Reception when they arrive at college and should collect them from the Principalship after 2pm the same day.

Unfortunately, any students who do not renew their pass on a Monday will need to make their own travel arrangements for the rest of that week. Only in exceptional circumstances and with prior agreement from the Finance Team will passes be renewed at other times.

DID YOU KNOW?

Brief	A clear statement of the Design objective/Design task.
Centre punch	A tool that makes small indents (dots) in metal so that drill bits can be positioned accurately.
Chisel	Cutting and gouging tool for use mainly on wood. Sometimes used in conjunction with a wood lathe.
CNC	Computer Numerical Control.
Corrosion	Usually associated with the 'rotting' of metals due to the action of the air.
Ductile	Property of a material in which it can be stretched without easily
