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## Excellent finish to the half term



We have had an excellent start to the year, with a clear focus on continued high standards across all aspects of the college. I have had the pleasure of working closely with the cadets and our Duke of Edinburgh participants. Both of these are truly brilliant examples of how each student can develop themselves personally, professionally and culturally.

During the previous academic year, we had 92 different employer opportunities for students across all year groups, including mentoring, lectures and site visits. That's around 1 in 2 days where a local or national business has been in actively working with our students. We are looking to generate as many meaningful encounters during this year; we've already had many trips to our sponsor university, Manchester Metropolitan, and our STEM project days earlier in October were a fantastic showcase of what we do best at UTCW.

I would encourage every student to take grasp of all the opportunities we provide in the coming weeks and months.





The teams taking part in the Royal Navy Engineering Challenge have made an excellent start to the competition. Their task is to deal with a humanitarian crisis on a Caribbean island, using their design and manufacturing skills to create a robust Engineering solution!

## Project based learning inspires

#### Coding and engineering

In October, all students took part in the first of our STEM project based learning days for this year. Year 10 students worked with MakoCreate on a number of coding and creative engineering tasks, whilst Year 11, 12 and 13 took part in a day of Engineering design and manufacturing to compete in team challenges to test the winning designs. One student commented: "These were the best days ever."

## New bus route

#### Free for UTC students

After half term, we are introducing a new trial bus service for UTC students. This bus will pick up in Birchwood, Culcheth, Golborne/Lowton, Newton-le-Willows and Winwick. A timetable has been sent home via Parent Mail. Anybody wishing to use this service must register via the electronic form so we know where to pick up.

Please note, this revised route will be trialled and closely monitored for student usage. If too few students use this transport offer, it will be postponed until September 2020.

## Public transport tickets

#### Bus and rail passes

Travel tickets for both rail and bus services will only be renewed each Monday. Students will be required to leave their pass at Reception when they arrive at college and should collect them from the Principalship after 2pm the same day. Unfortunately, any students who do not renew their pass on a Monday will need to make their own travel arrangements for the rest of that week. Only in exceptional circumstances and with prior agreement from the Finance Team will passes be renewed at other times.

As a reminder, the UTC building is open at the following times for students:


#### Monday to Thursday, 8:00am - 3:00pm / Friday, 8:00am - 2:00pm.

## Strong start to CCF


#### Cadets
