Year 10 are coming to the end of their topic on the Newly Emerging economy of Nigeria. After half term, they will be investigating how the UK's economy is changing.

Year 11 are finishing their topic on Urban Challenges. They will be moving on to studying Resource management. We will examine how food, water and energy are in increasing demand, and the challenges this presents for the world.

Computer Science

NSC Award


Students have been taking part in the NCS programme. Students were learning about Mental Health, Finance and working on Social Impact projects.



Meetings tend to take place every Monday, Wednesdays, Thursdays and Fridays after college, and occasionally throughout the day.


Knowing what steps we can take to support our mental wellbeing can help us feel better, sleep better and have better relationships with the people around us – and that goes not just for today but for the future too.
