- Year 10 – Thursday 17th December – 1:20pm




Last day of term – Finish at 12:20pm:

As always, we would like to thank you for your ongoing support and wish you a restful, happy and safe Christmas break.




Engineering



Engineering learners are all continuing to study their BTEC courses whether this be Level 1, 2 or 3.

KS4 L1/2 students are studying Construction, focusing on AutoCAD drawings in Year 10 and their exam unit for Year 11 learners. Engineering is focusing on the engineering world, learning about the design process. Some are learning about workshop tools and equipment for Unit 7 Machining Techniques.

KS5 L3 students are learning a variety of different units including Maths, Physics, researching the use of products, manual drawing and CAD drawings for both Civil and Engineering courses, as well as BIM (Building Information Modelling). Learners in Year 12 are focusing on Unit 10 Section A, 3D Modelling using Fusion 360.



Geography



Year 10

This week in Geography, students have been evaluating the impact of transport improvements to the UK economy. We have examined the impact of HS2, the new container terminal at the Port of Liverpool and the proposed third runway at Heathrow. We have also studied the new Mersey Gateway Bridge – the largest infrastructure project outside of London.


As we come to the end of the unit “The Economic World”, all students should be preparing for their end-of-term assessment on Monday 14th December. Students have been set revision quizzes on Teams, plus have access to knowledge organisers and extra quiz questions. I am so proud of the hard work that all Year 10 have put in during this first term. After Christmas, we will begin our next world unit, “The Challenge of Natural Hazards”. We will be examining the impact of economic development on the ability to deal with hazards.

Year 11

As the mock exams have come to a close, we have resumed work on our curriculum. This week, Year 11 have been examining the ways in which we can ensure sustainable food supplies for the future. We have studied a local project in Liverpool – Farm Urban, who grow crops using Aquaponics underground.

We are excited to hopefully be working more closely with them in the New Year.


Computer Science



Key Stage 5: this half term, students in Key Stage 5 have managed to create their own virtual network using Raspberry Pi's using Palo Alto Firewalls, Servers and different switches.

Year 11 students have been preparing for their GCSE exams and have been learning about Networks. They have also have been finishing off their Programming project using Python to develop their solutions to the problem. Year 10s have been learning about Hardware and Software as well as number bases. The students have also experienced the use of www.immersivelabs.online to develop their Cyber Security skills through the UTC Cyber Day.

In ICT, Year 10s and 11s have both been working on their coursework this term, creating animations, digital images and websites in the process. Year 11s need to ensure, as well as having a well-deserved break over Christmas, that they revise for the R081 exam which is taking place on 11th January.

Extra-Curricular/Enrichment



Virtual Work Experience for NMCN is continuing to run with Year 12 and 13 learners, who have been calculating the dimensions required for the water pipes to be fitted into the dry well. Learners meet every Monday at 3pm to have an online meeting with staff from NMCN and also as a group throughout the week, when they have study time to develop the project further. NMCN staff member John Marsh ran an AutoCAD 3D session with learners from 3pm until 4.30pm on Monday 7th December remotely. Photos of Monday's sessions have been sent on WhatsApp.

Additionally, two learners in Year 13 are continuing Virtual Work Experience with DATS, a local CAD company, via Teams meetings. The project involves redesigning the iconic Mini Cooper Car to make it more sustainable and modern via manual sketching techniques and Fusion 360. David Mallard is our link employer, he has attended the UTC during the pandemic to have face-to-face meetings with learners to discuss their progress and provide guidance and advice for their next session.

Design Slam Challenge

The Design Slam Challenge event on Thursday 26th November involved a combination of Year 12 and 13 learners studying Engineering and Art working together to design an autonomous car for the future. Learners were set a design brief at 9am from Jason Condliffe from MMU and Julian Turner from Westfield Technology Group. Learners were provided with a specification to design the car of the future and split up into seven teams. Both link employers were greatly impressed with teams 5 and 7. As a result, learners were set a challenge to begin 'Design Slam Challenge Stage 2', developing designs further as a whole class project, undertaking all requirements of the design process. The final design will be generated as a 3d model at MMU at The Fablab, and a prototype small scale model created by Westfield Technology Group. Additionally, learners will have the opportunity to have their whole class project advertised at Media City and on Social Media.





Network Rail Mock Assessment Day

This week Network Rail have been putting Sixth Form students through their paces in the form of a mock assessment day. The students participated in a range of group-based activities designed to bring the best out of them in a simulated recruitment environment. The team from Network Rail used mobile technology to interact with the students in real-time.



Students then had to perform in a one-to-one interview having their CVs and skills reviewed. It is hoped that, following this experience, many of the students will be confident enough to apply for forthcoming vacancies within the business.
