3. Objective

3.1. The key objectives of UTC Warrington's accessibility plan is to reduce and eliminate any barriers to access the curriculum and to encourage full participation in the college community for current pupils and prospective pupils with a disability and to help provide a safe, caring and friendly environment for all members of UTC Warrington. In particular, this Accessibility Plan sets out the proposals of how UTC Warrington intends to increase access to education for disabled pupils in three key areas, as follows:

3.1.1 Promoting opportunities for disabled pupils to participate in the UTC Warrington curriculum;

3.1.2 Developing the environment of UTC Warrington to ensure that disabled pupils can take advantage of education and associated services; and,

3.1.3 Ensuring that information is provided in the appropriate formats for disabled pupils so that they are not disadvantaged.
