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1. Compliance

2. About this accessibility plan

- 2.1. This document should be read in conjunction with the UTC Warrington's Equality Statement.
- 2.2. Everyone at UTC Warrington has equal value. The UTC Warrington Equality Statement is based on the principle of respect for each individual. The UTC Warrington is committed to taking positive action in the spirit of the Equality Act 2010 and all members of the UTC Warrington are committed to developing a culture of inclusion, support and awareness within the UTC Warrington so that each individual can grow and flourish regardless of Sex, Race, Religion Faith or Belief, Disability, Age, Sexual Orientation, Age, Gender Re-assignment, Marriage and Civil Partnership and Pregnancy and Maternity (the Protected Characteristics).

3. Objectives

- 3.1. The key objectives of the UTC Warrington's accessibility plan is to reduce and eliminate any barriers to access the curriculum and to full participation in the UTC Warrington community for current pupils and prospective pupils with a disability and to help provide a safe, caring and friendly environment for all members of the UTC Warrington. In particular, this Accessibility Plan sets out the proposals of how the UTC Warrington intends to increase access to education for disabled pupils in three key areas, as follows:
 - 3.1.1. promoting opportunities for disabled pupils to participate in the UTC Warrington curriculum;
 - 3.1.2. developing the environment of the UTC Warrington to ensure that disabled pupils can take advantage of education and associated services; and,
 - 3.1.3. ensuring that information is provided in the appropriate formats for disabled pupils so that they are not disadvantaged.
